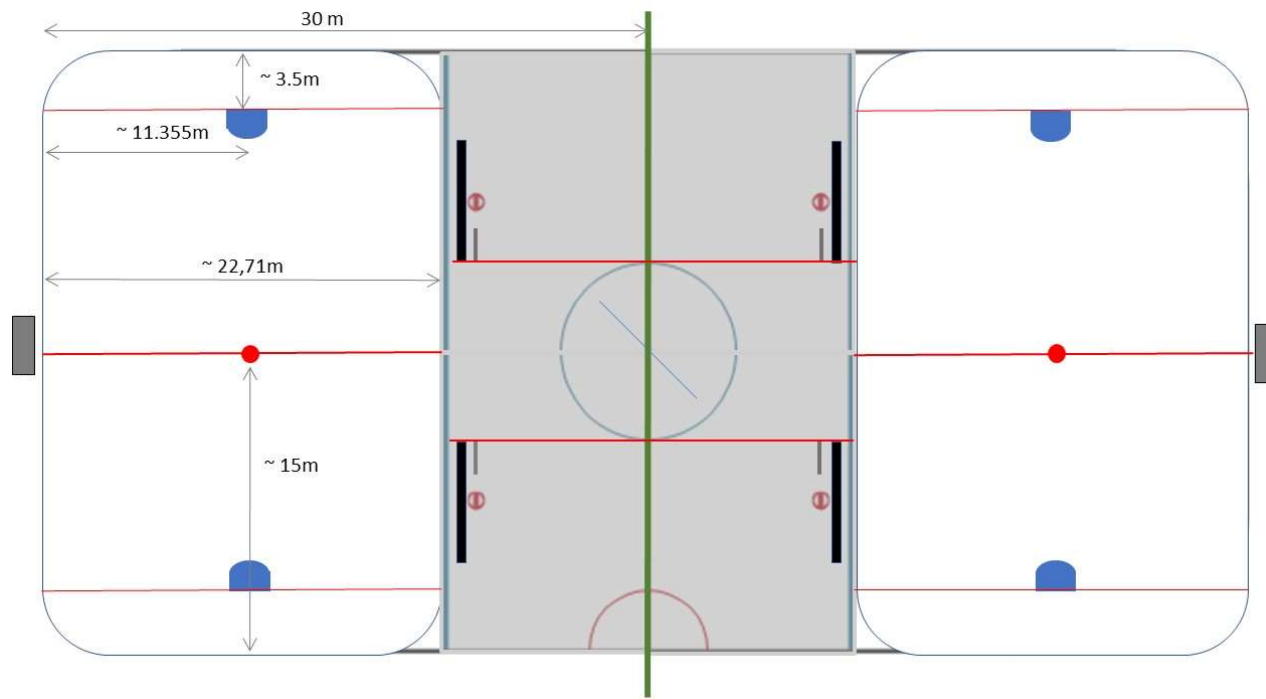

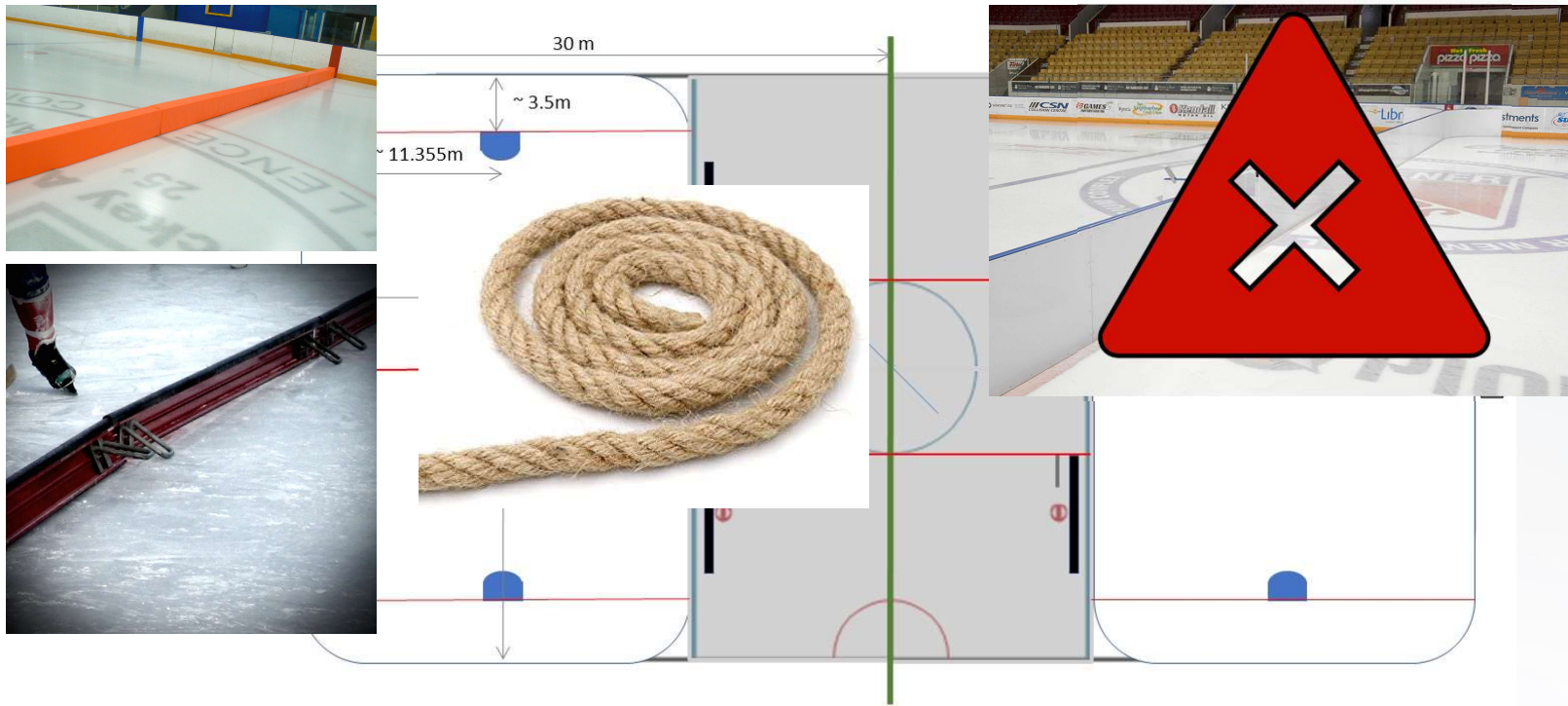

# the format – behind the rules

- team composition
  - 11 skaters and 2 goaltenders
  - one player per nation
- line composition
  - lines based on skill level
  - 1<sup>st</sup> line with 3 skaters, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> with 4 skaters



# the format – behind the rules



- team composition
  - 11 skaters and 2 goaltenders → 9 players and 1 goaltenders
  - one player per nation → depends on the setting if you mix players
- line composition
  - lines based on skill level → discussion point ! Depending on the goals
  - 1<sup>st</sup> line with 3 skaters, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> with 4 skaters → depends on team composition

# the format – behind the rules

- game duration
  - game time – 48-minutes
  - 3 periods – 16-minutes
- line rotations
  - 60-seconds shifts
  - set line matchups – 1<sup>st</sup> vs 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> vs 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> vs 3<sup>rd</sup>
  - 16-minutes ice time per player





# the format – behind the rules



- game duration
  - game time – 48-minutes → can be adapted
  - 3 periods – 16-minutes → can be adapted
- line rotations
  - 60-seconds shifts → shifts are too long, 45-seconds
  - set line matchups – 1<sup>st</sup> vs 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> vs 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> vs 3<sup>rd</sup> → crucial ! discussion point
  - 16-minutes ice time per player

# the format – behind the rules

- stoppage of play
  - the game never stops
  - interventions reduced to a minimum
  - face-offs limited to minimum
  - no offside
  - no icing
  - no timeout
  - no penalty shot calls



# the format – behind the rules

- penalties
  - individual penalties transformed to team sanctions
  - penalties carried over to next shift
  - duration is the entire next shift, even if a goal is scored
  - last shift penalties transformed to penalty shot

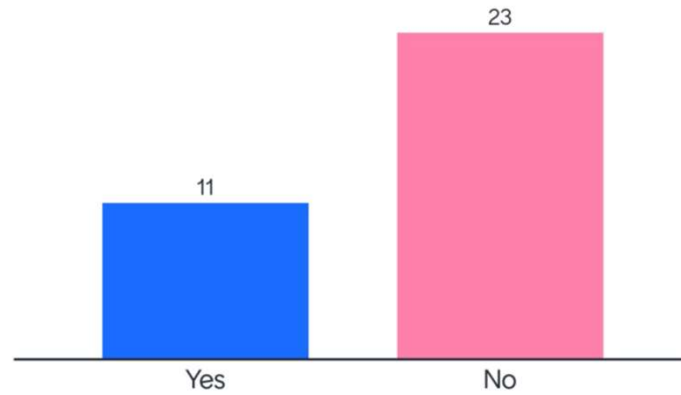

# Lausanne 2020 YOG – success factors



- high attractiveness
  - Best players selected through National Skills Challenges.
  - Fast and dynamic game, a lot of shots, saves, goals and other game actions.
  - Two simultaneous games to double the amount of action.
  - In house animation
- united ice hockey family
  - A unique format with players from a different countries in every team.
  - Once in a lifetime opportunity for lower-ranked MNAs.
  - Boost for athletes and countries winning medals.
  - International cooperation – stronger together.

# Lausanne 2020 YOG – success factors



- atmosphere and fans
  - Great atmosphere in the arena
  - Festival-like event with entertainment during the games of the ice
  - Ice hockey as part of something bigger – bring nations together
- organizational frame
  - unique cooperation with MNAs and NOCs prior and during event
  - IIHF-assigned staff – especially Team Coaches – with smooth and professional operation of the event
  - smooth and functioning game technology



# Lausanne 2020 YOG – key takeaways



- it works
  - understandable, playable and attractive
  - combining skills level is possible
  - mixing teams impacts skills, social behavior
  - mixed teams trigger social skills

# Lausanne 2020 YOG – key takeaways



- it is different
  - 32-minutes ice time per day on competition level for every single player
  - higher intensity than full ice games (player feedbacks)
  - through the roof game action
  - increase of 1-on-1 battles
  - unforgivable to mistakes
  - exposes inattentiveness
  - quick hands, quick feet and quick thinking

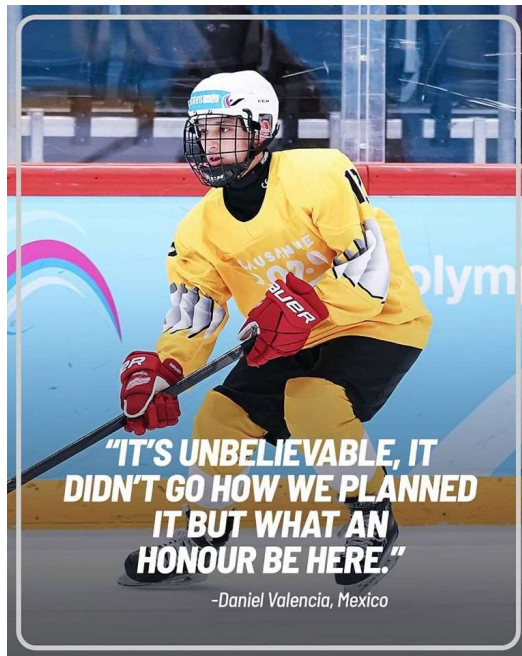

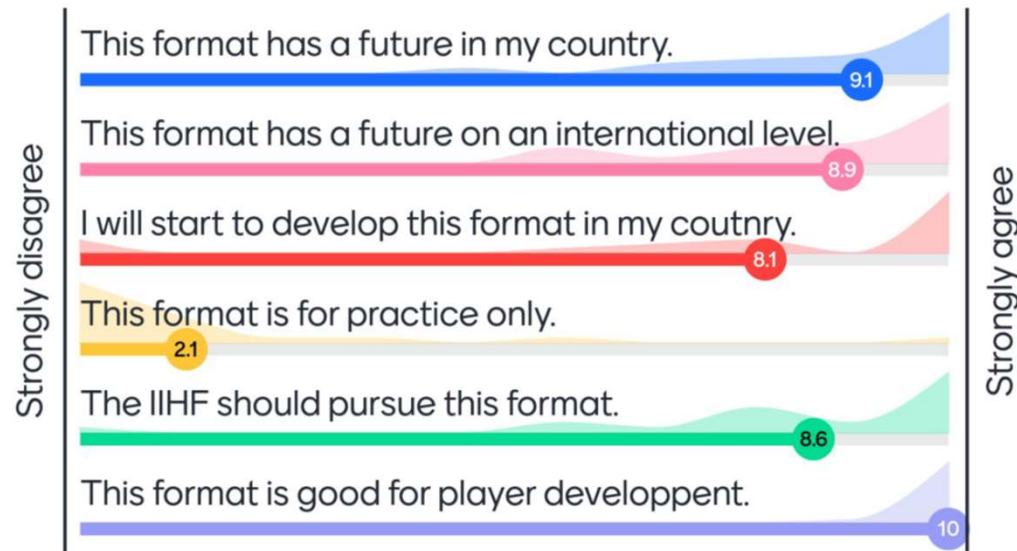
